Fun Pop Up Inside Card – inspired by Melissa Faust

You will need:

Round We Go Bundle

In Colour DSP

Pretty in Pink cardstock

Pretty in Pink ink

Basic White cardstock

Basic Black cardstock

In Colour Shimmer Gems

Everyday Details dies

Baker's Twine Essentials pack

Dotted Circles 3D embossing folder

Measurements

Pretty in Pink card base 14.5 x 21cm scored at 10.5cm

Pretty In Pink card front 14.5 x 10.5cm


Basic White 14 x 16cm scored at 3, 6, 9 cm on long side

In Colour DSP for die cutting

Pretty in Pink, Basic Black and Basic White scraps for die cutting



How To – watch a video for complete installation at Handmade by Julia Quinn

1. Fold the Pretty in Pink card base in half
2. Layer the 10.5 x 14.5 card front piece on top of the card base so it lines up perfectly
3. Die cut the circle die from the Everyday Details dies through the card base and card front top
4. Using the Dotted Circles embossing folder, emboss the card front including the die cut circle
5. Adhere the card front (without the die cut circle) to the front of the card
6. Score and fold the basic white along the score lines so it looks like the diagram
7. Adhere just the long flat piece of the basic white  onto the inside of the card on the right hand side
8. Adhere the first 3 cm piece to the card front – avoid adding glue under where the circle is cut out – the best way to do this is to have the basic white folded flat closed to it adheres in the right position
9. With the card folded flat, you can see the score lines through the circle die cut hole from the front
10. Add adhesive onto the second scored section of the basic white
11. Adhere the circle right in the middle of the card front lining it up perfectly
12. Embellish the card as you wish – die cut rosettes using the Round we Go dies (these rosettes have been cut in half length ways to make them smaller. Also die cut more images from the dies,
