

Pets & More Card Class



Card 1 – Happy Birthday

Measurements:

Thick Basic White card base: A5 (14.8cm x 21cm)
scored and folded to 14.8cm x 10.5cm

Basic Black: 14.3cm x 10cm

Basic White: 13.8cm x 9.5cm, 5.5cm x 3.5cm (3), scraps

Supplies:

Stamps: Pets & More, Simply Said

Inks: Memento black, Pecan Pie, Early Espresso, Crumb Cake, Smoky Slate

Ribbon: Natural Polka Dot Trim

Instructions:

1. Score lines ½" apart lengthways on the white panel using a score board. Lightly drag a Pecan Pie ink pad across the panel lengthways to create the look of woodgrain. Drag an Early Espresso (spot) ink pad lightly over to create some darker tones. Adhere to the black mat. Wrap a piece of polka dot trim around the panel and secure on the back with glue dots or tape. Adhere to the card base.
2. Stamp the dog, cat and rabbit images in Memento black ink onto the 3 small white panels.
3. For the dog image, flip the stamp over on the block and stamp the reverse image over the dog outline in Crumb Cake ink.
4. For the cat image, stamp the reverse image over the outline in Smoky Slate ink.
5. For the rabbit image, stamp the reverse image over the outline in Crumb Cake ink after stamping off first (second generation stamping).
6. Use the brush tip of a Basic Black marker to create a narrow black border on the edge of each stamped panel. Use Dimensionals to adhere them to the card front as shown.
7. Stamp the greeting on a strip of white in black ink. Trim to size and use a black marker on the edges. Attach with Dimensionals to the card front as shown.



Card 2 – Blue and White

Measurements:

Thick Basic White card base: A5 (14.8cm x 21cm)
scored and folded to 14.8cm x 10.5cm

Basic White: 13.8cm x 9.5cm, 9cm x 9cm

Supplies:

Stamps: Pets & More

Dies: Spotlight on Nature

Inks: Memento black, Boho Blue

Blends: Grey Granite, Crumb Cake, SU1000, Real Red

Instructions:

1. Die cut a decorative edge circle from white cardstock using one of the Spotlight on Nature dies. Stamp the dog and cat images in Memento Black onto the circle. Tip: put both stamps on a D block and stamp them at the same time. Colour with Stampin' Blends alcohol markers. I used light and dark Crumb Cake for the dog, light and dark Grey Granite for the cat and the SU1000 (light pink) for the cat's nose and ears. I used dark Crumb Cake for the ground and dark Real Red for the dog's tag.
2. Stamp the food bowl, tennis ball and fish in a random pattern on the white panel in Boho Blue ink. Tip: put the three images together on block B and stamp all at the same time. Use a blending brush to lightly apply the same colour ink to the panel, starting from the edges and working towards the centre in a circular motion. This takes away the starkness of the white.
3. Adhere the patterned panel to the card front as shown. Use foam Dimensionals to attach the dog and cat panel to the card, slightly higher than the middle, to allow for the addition of a greeting strip at the bottom if needed.



Card 3 – Just a Note

Measurements:

Thick Very Vanilla card base: A5 (14.8cm x 21cm)
scored and folded to 14.8cm x 10.5cm

Designer Series Paper: 14.3cm x 10cm

Very Vanilla: 8.3cm x 5cm

Basic Black: Narrow strips 0.5cm wide.

Supplies:

Stamps: Pets & More, Simply Said

Inks: Memento black

Blends: Crumb Cake

Instructions:

1. Stamp the dog and greeting in Memento black ink on the Very Vanilla panel. Colour the dog in with light and dark Crumb Cake Stampin' Blends alcohol markers.
2. Adhere the stamped panel in the centre of the DSP so that there is a 2.5cm border on all 4 sides. Tip: place the panel on the paper and when it is lined up correctly, use a pencil to mark where the corners are on the paper – these will be covered up with the black strips.
3. Starting from the top left corner of the stamped panel, glue a narrow strip of black cardstock along the edge of the vanilla panel, to the edge of the DSP. Then rotate the panel and glue a strip down the right side of the vanilla panel, to the bottom of the DSP. Rotate again and glue another strip from the bottom right corner of the stamped panel to the left edge of the DSP. Add the final strip along the left side of the stamped panel to the top of the DSP. Tip: run a fine line of glue on the DSP first, then place the strip on top, butting it up against the stamped cardstock. Trim off the overhanging strips with scissors. Adhere to the card front.
