Add a small bottle of something special or chocolates, jokes, small gifts, scratch and win tickets etc.



Measurements

Paper	Number of Pieces	Metric Measurement	Imperial Measurement
Real Red Cardstock	1	21cm x 25cm scored with the 25cm edge at the top at 2.4, 5, 6, 7 & 21cm	8" x 10" scored with the 10" edge at the top at 1", 2", 2 ½", 3" & 8 ¾"
		Turn and score the 21cm side at 3.3, 6.6, 9.9, 13.2, 16.5 & 19.8cm	Turn and score the 8" side at 1 ¼", 2 ½", 3 ¾", 5", 6 ¼" & 7 ½"
Reindeer Days DSP	6	2.8cm x 13.6cm	1" x 5 ¼"
Basic White Cardstock	1	7cm x 10cm	
Silver Threaded Twine	1	39cm	15.5"



Instructions

- 1. Cut and score the cardstock as per the dimensions in the cutting guide above. Use the diagram above for reference.
- 2. Trim away the corners where it says remove on the diagram above. Fold and burnish the scorelines, all are mountain folds except the 4th from the left is a valley fold.
- 3. Fold the valley fold so the valley edge is facing you and the rest of the piece is flat. At the intersection of the score lines punch out a small half circle. Use the diagram above for reference.
- 4. Fold the first scoreline on the left over the next section to the right and glue into place, this forms the top.
- 5. Put glue on the remaining tabs in the part where you removed the 2 sections in step 2. Fold the other side of the cardstock over to meet this so a hexagon cylinder shape is created.
- 6. Attach the DSP to each section, moving around in order so the pattern continues around the holder.
- 7. Locate the join and turn to the back, start threading the twine through the holes so you end up with the tails together at the front. If using a bottle put it into the holder now. Pull as tight as you can without ripping the cardstock and tie a bow.
- 8. Die-cut a Basic White circle using the middle size Stylish Shapes Die. Stamp Merry Christmas using Real Red ink and the stamp from Humble Home.
- 9. Die-cut or fussy cut a reindeer from the Reindeer Days DSP. Adhere to the circle using dimensionals. Adhere to the holder using liquid glue.
