



Soft Vintage Beautiful Butterflies Birthday Cards

Measurements

Paper	Number of Pieces	Metric Measurement	Imperial Measurement
Basic White Thick Cardstock – Base - Butterfly Shape	1	10.5cm x 29.7cm scored at 14.85cm 10cm x 12.5cm	4 1/4" x 11" scored at 5 1/2" 4" x 5"
Basic White Cardstock – Layer - Die cut Butterflies	1 2	10cm x 14.4cm 8cm x 10cm	4" x 5 ¼" 3" x 4"
Basic Beige Bordered Ribbon	2	38cm	15"
Gold Twisted Thread	2	15cm	6"
Basic White Cardstock – Inner	1	9.7cm x 14.1cm	3 7/8" x 5 1/8"

Instructions

- Cut all the cardstock layers and pieces needed as stated in the measurement guide.
 Cut and score the card base as stated, scoring and folding in half. Die cut the butterfly shape using the die lined up on the fold of the cardstock.
- 2. Stamp the detailed wing stamps onto the shaped butterfly card using Pretty in Pink ink that has been stamped off, so you have a lighter version of the colour.

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- 3. Stamp the long writing stamp from Elements of Text using Petal Pink ink that is stamped off to you have a lighter version. Stamp twice on both the butterfly shape and the Basic White card layer. It's good to overlap this with the other stamping.
- 4. Stamp the splodge stamps randomly as well using Pecan Pie ink stamped off first.
- 5. On the layer for the card also add the butterfly stamps using stamped off Petal Pink ink.
- 6. On both cards add some soft sponging of the same colours using a blending brush for each colour. I sponged the same ink colour over the stamped images in the same colour. Then I added Pecan Pie around the edges.
- 7. Emboss the Basic White layer using the Beautiful Butterflies Hybrid Embossing Folder in a portrait direction. Take care to ensure the large butterfly is positioned fully onto the cardstock.
- 8. Place the die cut detailed butterfly onto the shaped card in the centre using small pieces of dimensionals for the edges of the wings and a glue dot or tombo on the body. For the other card the detailed butterfly is positioned over top of the embossed butterfly in the same way.
- 9. Take the Basic Beige Bordered Ribbon and cut in half lengthways. Take the 2 lengths and form a rough bow. Take the Gold Twisted Thread and tie in a double knot through the centre to hold the bow shape. You can play with the ends and loops to get the shape you like.
- 10. You can now fray the ribbon, so you get wispy pieces of thread on the loops and the tails. You can also fray the gold thread.
- 11. Add 3 gold Low Profile Dots.
- 12. Stamp a butterfly on the inner using Fresh Freesia ink. Adhere inside the card on top of the Fresh Freesia layer.
