Heirloom Arrangements Kit Alternative Card Design

Measurements

Paper	Number of Pieces	Metric Measurement	Imperial Measurement
Crumb Cake Cardstock – Base	1	8.5cm x 25.5cm Scored at 8.5cm & 17cm	3 ¼" x 9 ¾" scored at 3 ¼"& 6 ½"
Heirloom Arrangements Pretty In Pink Card Base x 1 to make	3	8cm x 8cm	3" x 3"
Basic White Cardstock – Arches (depends on die you use)	4	8cm x 11.5cm	3" x 4 ½"
Basic White Cardstock - Butterfly	1	2.5cm x 3.5cm	1" x 1 ¼"

Instructions

- 1. Cut the cardstock and pieces needed as stated in the measurement guide. Cut and score the card base as stated, scoring and folding on each score line.
- 2. Add the pieces from the kit card base to the 3 sections on the card base. For the one that is in 2 parts adhere the larger part first as it's easier.
- 3. Starting with the first panel stamp the butterfly using Pretty In Pink ink. You can choose to stamp directly onto the arch or onto a scrap piece of Basic White and cut out the butterfly.
- 4. Then lay the floral images on to get the placement how you want it and adhere the vellum piece using liquid glue and the floral bouquet using dimensionals. If you cut your butterfly, use a dimensional to attach that now too.
- 5. Stamp the sentiment of your choice onto one of the labels from the kit using Pecan Pie ink. Attach with dimensionals.
- 6. For the centre arch stamp the grid stamp using Crumb Cake ink that has been stamped off. I stamped 3 times, once at the top and twice on the right-hand side stamping off each time. Now lay the pieces on to get the placement right before attaching the tag and green leaf piece with liquid glue and the large floral arrangement with dimensionals.
- 7. On the last arch I also stamped the grid stamp with Crumb Cake ink, top, and on both sides. I placed the elements first for positioning and then stuck the bell-shaped flowers to the sunflower tag before adhering to the arch. Then I tucked the Pretty peacock vellum leaves in on the right. I placed a dimensional under the yellow flower head and liquid glue for the stem. Then I placed the pretty Peacock butterfly using dimensionals.

- 8. Next, I added Brushed Brass Butterflies and Low Profile Dots to each panel as pictured.
- 9. Lastly, I added the 4^{th} white arch to the back of the 3^{rd} arch with liquid glue and a flower to the bottom right corner.
