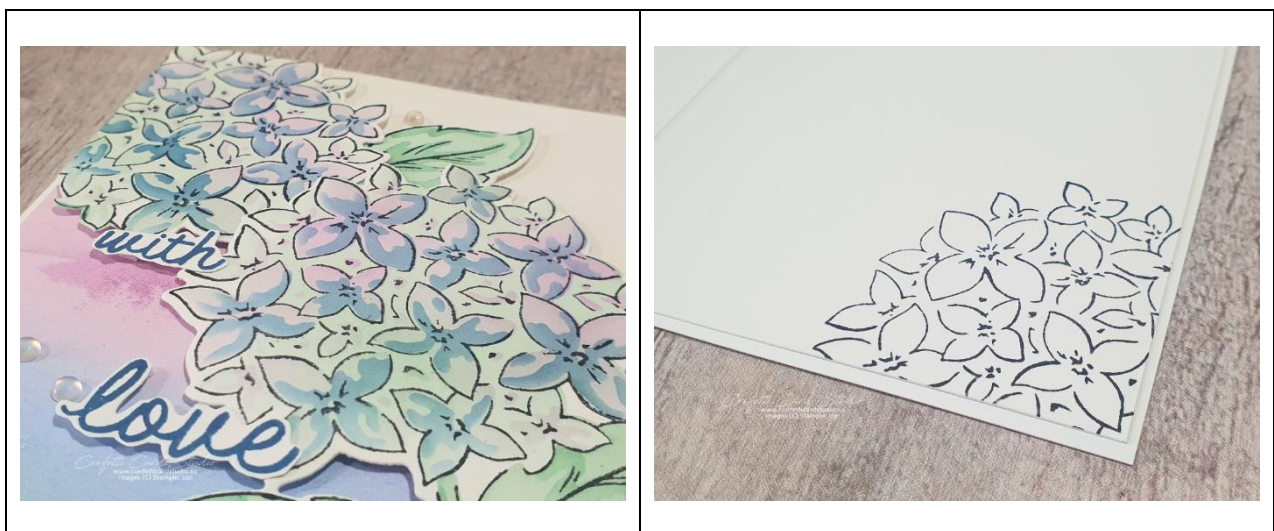
## Measurements

Paper	Number of Pieces	Metric Measurement	Imperial Measurement
Basic White Thick Cardstock - Card Base	1	14.9cm x 21cm Scored at 10.5cm	5 ½" x 8 ½" Scored at 4 ¼"
Basic White Cardstock - Layer	1	10cm x 14.4cm	4" x 5 ¼"
- Stamping	1	8cm x 21cm	3 ¼" x 8 ½"
- Inner	1	10cm x 14.4cm	4" x 5 ¼"
Thoughtful Journey 6" x 6" Designer Series Paper	1	10cm x 14.4cm	4" x 5 ¼"



## Instructions

1. Cut all the cardstock layers and pieces needed as stated in the measurement guide. Cut and score the card base as stated, scoring and folding in half.
2. Cut the piece of designer series paper (DSP) from the top left corner to approx. 4.5cm (1 ¾") from the bottom on the right hand-side. Adhere to the Basic White Layer.
3. Stamp the hydrangea stamp twice on the stamping piece using Memento black ink. Tape lightly to some scrap paper. Place the leaf mask, number 4, over the leaves on 1 image and line up. Trace the triangle cut out from the mask onto your scrap paper for easy placement of the other masks. You can start with the leaves or position the large flower from mask number 1 lining up the triangle mark and using the stamped image to help you find the right position.
4. Flower colours = Mask 1- Pool Party, Mask 2 – Petunia Pop, Mask 3 – Misty Moonlight
5. Leaf colours = Mask 4 – Pool Party, Mask 5 – Pool Party darker
6. Die cut the shapes with the dies from Thankful Garden Dies. On one of the die cut flowers remove the leaves by trimming with your paper snips. Lay the flowers on the card so they cover the diagonal cut edge of the DSP. Once you know your placement add dimensionals and adhere them to the layer.
7. Flip the layer over and trim away the overhanging portions of the flowers and leaves. Adhere to the card base.
8. Stamp your sentiment using Misty Moonlight ink. Either fussy cut like my example, trim into a neat shape or use a die to frame it. Adhere with dimensionals.
9. Add three clear Cherry Cobbler & Pearl Adhesive Backed Berries.
10. Stamp a portion of the hydrangea stamp onto the bottom right corner of the inner piece using Memento ink. Adhere into the card.
