## Measurements

Pecan Pie Cardstock			
- Arches	6	9.5cm x 13cm	3 ¾" x 5"
- Die cut Flower	1	2cm x 6cm	<sup>3</sup> ⁄4" x 2 <sup>1</sup> ⁄4"
Beautiful Gallery 6" x 6" Designer Series Paper			
- Arches	2	7.5cm x 15.2cm	3" x 6"
Basic White Cardstock	1	7.5cm x 11cm	3" x 4 ¼"
- Arches	1	8.5cm x 12cm	3 ½" x 4 ¾"
Printer Paper	1	7cm x 27.3cm	2 ¾" x 10 ¾"
Scraps of Crumb Cake			
– 2 x Die cuts	1	4.5cm x 18cm	1 ¾"" x 7"
- Sentiment	1	1.7cm x 4.5cm	5/8" x 1 ¾"
Mossy Meadow Cardstock - die cut leaves	1	2.5cm x 9cm	1" x 3 ½"
Basic Beige Cardstock			
- Stamping	1	4cm x 7cm	1 ½" x 2 ¾"

# Instructions

- Cut all the cardstock and designer series paper pieces needed as stated in the measurement guide using the Everyday Arches Dies 2<sup>nd</sup> from largest for the Pecan Pie arches, 4<sup>th</sup> from largest for the designer series paper arches and one of the Basic White. Then 3<sup>rd</sup> from largest for the other Basic White arch (for the back).
- 2. \*Sponge Pecan Pie ink using a blending brush at the approximate places the arches will butt next to each other. Attach a Pecan Pie arch to the left-hand end of the printer paper, make sure no white from the printer paper is showing at the bottom or left. Butt the next arch next to the first one and then move back very slight amount to allow movement, the sponging will prevent white paper showing through. Do the same with the 3<sup>rd</sup> arch. Repeat on the back, this time lining each arch against the front one to make sure they are stacked exactly. Carefully fold so the 2<sup>nd</sup> arch goes behind the first (mountain fold) one and the 3<sup>rd</sup> goes behind the second (valley fold).
- 3. Stamp the words and splodges from Elements of Text using Versamark ink onto the smaller Basic White arch. Cover with Wow! White Embossing Powder, tap off the excess and heat to set. Use Crumb Cake ink on a Blending Brush to add colour to the background. The embossed words and splatter images will resist the ink and remain white. Flick some Pecan Pie ink from a Stampin' Write Marker or Blend over the background.
- 4. Adhere to the Pecan Pie arch with an even gap around. Adhere the 2 designer series paper arches to the other Pecan Pie arches as well.
- 5. Stamp the flower stamp using Pecan Pie ink onto Basic Beige cardstock. Use Wink of Stella or a blender pen to drag some colour upwards on the petals. Once dry, die cut using the corresponding shape die.
- 6. Die cut the flowers and leaves as shown using the Gallery Blooms and Beautiful Motifs dies. Adhere the flowers and leaves as shown to the arches.
- 7. Take approx. 15cm (6") of Linen Thread and tie a bow, adhere with a glue dot to finish the arrangement on the far-right arch.
- 8. Stamp the sentiment onto the Crumb Cake cardstock using Pecan Pie ink. Adhere using dimensionals.
- 9. Add three Adhesive-Backed Textured Dots.
- 10. Stamp the Queen Anne's lace flower using Pecan Pie ink stamped off once onto the larger Basic White arch. Adhere to the back of the card on the arch of your choice.

\*NB: Not shown in video as I thought of it afterwards. In the video I scored the printer paper but as it's so thin I suggest you skip that, it will fold easily once the arches are attached.
