

# Pull tab flip card - with Floral Squares Dies

## Kit list

- Basic craft kit including adhesives and Stampin' Dimensionals, plus double-sided tape
- [Floral Squares Dies](#) (Part of [All Squared Away Bundle](#), which is 20% during March 2022)
- [Timeworn Type 3D Embossing Folder](#)
- Greeting stamps
- A paper trimmer plus a means of scoring
- Ink pad in a colour of your choice; I've used Gorgeous Grape
- Blending Brush or sponge
- Spatter stamp (I used [Quiet Meadow](#). The [Quiet Meadow Bundle](#) is 20% off during March 2022)
- A small narrow die such as the smallest label from [Seasonal Labels](#), or a craft knife to cut a narrow slot
- [Black & White gingham ribbon](#)

## Pull tab flip card

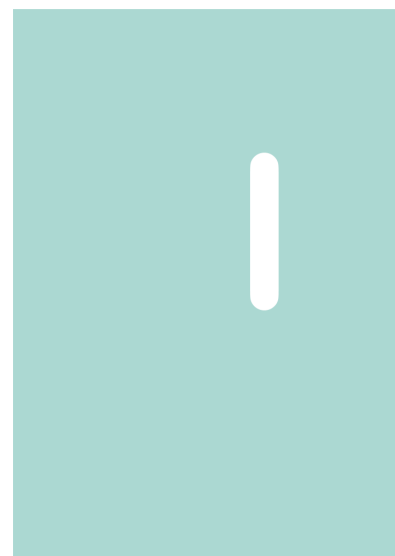
This is adapted for metric cardstock from [a video tutorial](#) by US demonstrator [Tami White](#).

## Measurements

- Standard card base in Crumb Cake/Sahara Sand, 14.8cm x 21cm, scored at 10.5cm
- White cardstock 10cm x 14.3cm
- White cardstock 6cm square
- White cardstock 5cm square
- White square flower die-cut using Floral Squares Dies.
- Three small black flowers die-cut using Floral Squares Dies.
- Crumb Cake/Sahara Sand 6.5cm square
- Crumb Cake/Sahara Sand 5.5cm square
- Crumb Cake/Sahara Sand 17cm x 5cm (this may need trimming down further)
- About 50cm of ribbon

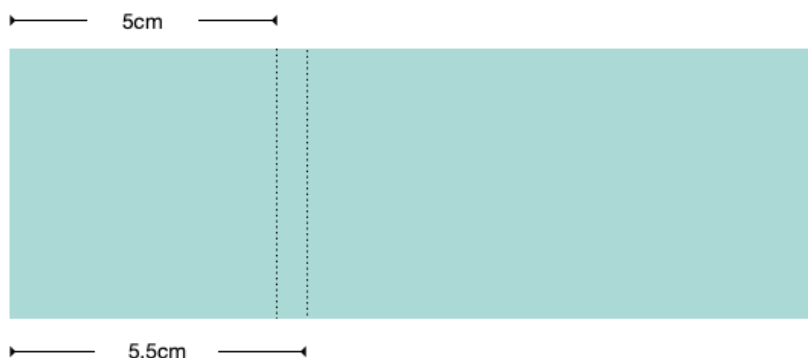
## Instructions

1. Cut a slot in the embossed piece, using the die or manually. It needs to be about 5mm-1cm wide and no more than 5.5cm tall. Positioned it just to the right and above the centre, as shown.
2. Emboss using Timeworn Type 3D Embossing Folder. NB Cut before embossing as cutting afterwards will flatten the embossed areas.



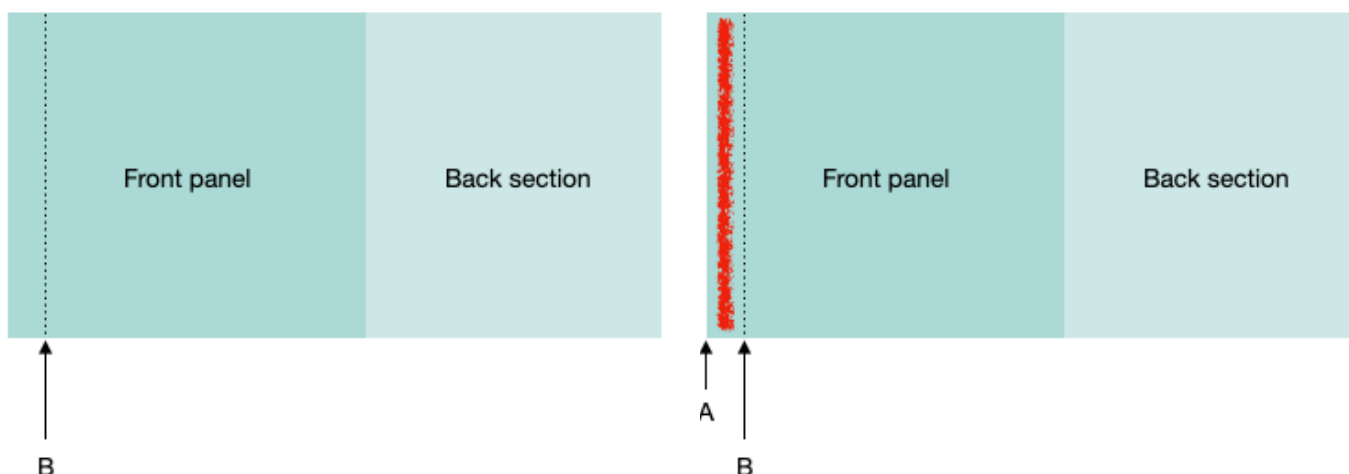
3. Sponge/brush the embossed piece at the top left and bottom right. If you have a spatter stamp, you can stamp this on top, too. Repeat on the 6cm and 5cm squares of white cardstock.
4. Stamp your greeting onto the smaller square. Mount both stamped/sponged squares onto the slightly larger squares of Crumb Cake/Sahara Sand and set aside. Don't add the die-cut shape just yet.

5. Take the long strip of Crumb Cake and score from one end at 5cm and 5.5cm, as shown.



6. Fold it up so the short section is on the top and crease both score lines really well. It should look like this.

7. Now take the small square stamped with the birthday greeting and stick it to the front panel. Centre it top and bottom and align it to score line **B** on the left.



8. Apply strong glue or tape to the section marked in red. It needs to be strong as this is the only thing which will hold on the front stamped square.
9. Take the larger stamped square and attach this to the glued section marked in red. Again, centre it top and bottom and align it to the left edge, marked **A**. **NB: This is very fiddly – tape may make it easier.**
10. You now have the pull tab ready to add to your card. Slide it through the slot and centre the square on the card so you can mark it at the point where you need to trim off the Crumb Cake tab. Remove and finish the end of the tab how you wish – square, rounded corners, a hole with some ribbon etc.
11. Slide it back in and centre the front panel with equal space left and right.
12. Keeping it in position, turn over the white panel and apply glue/tape around the edges, **avoiding the area where the tab needs to slide in and out**. Stick it to your card front. The tab should slide freely.

13. On the back of the greeting panel (the smaller square), at the outside edge (which will be on the right when the card is closed), apply a strip of tape. Making sure the square panel is in the centre, close it to attach the tape to the card. You should be able to pull the tab to reveal the greeting.
14. Decorate inside as desired.
15. Add three small black flowers at the bottom right in a row and finish by tying some gingham ribbon around the left edge, in a knot or a bow.
